RE: Air Passenger Duty

Following the letter published by many of our organisations in the Daily Telegraph on 25 July - 'Flight taxes needed' - we are writing to urge you to stand firm and implement the planned changes to Air Passenger Duty (APD).


We continue to support your original plans for a per-plane duty, as this would link the tax more closely to the actual greenhouse gas emissions. Nonetheless, we made it clear at the time of the Budget that your eventual decision to increase the number of APD bands, and to increase the tax take more steeply on the longest flights, represented a significant improvement in environmental terms on the old APD structure.

Since then, there have been some objections from companies such as Ryanair calling for these changes to be reversed. Since the increase is only £1 per year on a short-haul economy flight, claims that the changes 'clobber hard-working families' simply do not stack up, and we are prepared to say so in public whenever the opportunity arises.

We understand the public pressures you are under on this emotive issue, but if the UK is to have a chance of meeting its legally-binding climate change targets, then emissions from aviation will have to be managed, and taxation is a vital tool to help achieve this. Misleading statements from the aviation industry must not force you to delay moving to a tax system that more fairly reflects the damage aviation does to the environment.

Again, we urge you to implement the planned changes, and please be assured that we will continue to back your decision in the media wherever possible.


